Thinking of providing a work placement for a WIP student? Here's some basic info to help inform your decision!

Who makes up the WIP class?

Participants are talented young leaders who are currently in Universities and Graduate Schools across Ireland and the UK. They are from diverse communities in Northern Ireland and Ireland, studying a wide variety of disciplines and with a broad range of interest and skill sets. What brings them together is that they have demonstrated significant leadership potential and have an extensive track record of serving others. 30 students are selected each summer through a highly competitive process. In addition to their work placement, students spend their summer engaged in service activities and leadership development while in D.C.

Work Placements

WIP provides a broad range of work placements from various sectors:

- Capitol Hill - then Senators Hillary Clinton & Barack Obama, Senator John McCain; Reps Peter King & Joe Crowley
- Government Agencies - Library of Congress, Environmental Protection Agency
- Media Outlets - ABC, CNN, and C-SPAN
- Nonprofits - Habitat for Humanity
- Higher Education - Georgetown Lombardi Center
- Business - Eli Lilly, Zurich
- Diplomatic Missions - the Embassy of Ireland and the Northern Ireland Bureau

Expectations of the Work Placement

Participants are very capable and able to make meaningful contributions during their placements. We entrust you to create a placement that is useful to you and the participant. We encourage supervisors to assign work that will be useful to the organization as well as to keep in mind the educational nature of these placements. We ask that they provide support and challenge, as well as facilitate opportunities to learn about different aspects of the work that you do.

Participants do have a demanding schedule with WIP outside of work and they may not be able to work additional hours outside of those outlined due to their educational commitments with us. However, while in your work place we expect them to be fully engaged with their work and keen to make a positive contribution to your team.

Practical Details

There is no direct cost to you. WIP is a registered non-profit and we raise funds through Government grants (Irish & Northern Irish), University contributions and public fundraising to cover the costs of the students. We appreciate when our Work Placements can support our fundraising initiatives, but there is no expectation or requirement that they do so.

WIP provides the students with a basic stipend to cover their travel & transport, coordinate their visa, and provide room and board.

Summer Schedule

Students are available for their Work Placements on a full-time schedule from Monday through Thursday for 6 weeks, beginning on June 13th until July 28th, with the exclusion of June 27th through July 1st.

Two evenings each week and all day Friday, students will participate in the various aspects of their leadership curriculum and service activities in the D.C. area.

Placement Process

Our work placement supervisors are regularly impressed by the caliber of WIP participants, and we are happy to connect you with workplace supervisors of past WIP students as well as provide sample resumes of former WIP participants.
